Layouts – (LC = Layout Coordinator)

1. Ashtown (N) – LC Martin Lockwood. Track is now laid on the RH end board, and the wiring has commenced. The traverser is still under construction at Martin's home, where some disruptions have slowed progress. Elsewhere, Bob is adjusting the platform edges that already exist (so the 9F doesn't lose its' cylinders every time it passes) and adding the missing pieces

– which is most of them, actually; in addition to which, he has also ballasted the tracks around the station area. Gareth has planted the signal box he made some time ago and ballasted/groundcovered around it. He has also completed ballasting and painting the works siding (including re-seating one of the uncoupling magnets so that it actually causes trucks to uncouple). Fencing along the trackside has started in the works area and some random bits of factory junk like broken pallets/barrels/oil-drums added.

As you see, Graham is building houses from a kit to add to the layout. Bob is also building another of the same kit, but his is more advanced so Graham is struggling to catch up!

The plan (aspiration) for the next month is to complete the woodwork on the traverser and start to integrate with the existing baseboards, continue, maybe complete, the platforms, continue with the



- scenic bits and pieces as well as constructing some of the many buildings required
- 2. Newton Wharf (N) LC Greg Deacon/lan Dodds. Now that the track is working reasonably well I am keen to ensure that it stays that way by running trains on it fairly regularly but, enjoyable as that is, it stops me from doing what I should be doing, i.e. making more building. It is a fairly large layout so there is a need for many more buildings more houses and a couple of factories. So it would be really nice if other members would occasionally run "N" gauge trains round the circuit??? I am not very happy with the back-scene as I made a bit of a bodge fitting it so would welcome suggestions as to how to improve it. Other than that it is plod on with buildings.
- 3. Phoenix Park (OO) LC Jeff Bamford/Pete Marshall. No progress worthy of reporting probably due to festive season.
- **4. Soarston Lower Level (DCC OO) LC Jim Duckworth/lan Dodds.** Due to family illness and New Year holidays, I have missed a few weeks working on the layout. I am catching up on some of the work now, still on the scenery, but unfortunately it will not be advanced enough to take to our Cotgrave exhibition this year.
- 5. Rise Park (N) LC Les Richardson. Most of the scenery is now complete except for the Market Place. We have had time off for good behaviour at the end of December so not a lot else done.
- **6. Victoria Road MPD (00) LC Bill Mossop.** With the Layout now just about completed, trial runs of all the operation of loco's and rolling stock have begun. The first outing for the Layout will be the Sileby Exhibition February 18/19. Testing transportation and setting up are also taking place.

- Graham's Railway Memories 1961, Horden Co Durham:- We had telephones on a loop covering locations in our area, and each unit had a 'call code'. By calling the codes for more than 1 unit, you could even have a conference call. Each point had a list of the codes, but Station Master Polly never knew about the 'special code' that wasn't in the list but everybody else knew. Horden Signal Box was about five minutes walk from the office the secret Code meant "Polly approaching Box for inspection get your girlfriend out"! A gentleman called Joe Levy was the signalman at Hart box. Signalmen worked hard at times, but also had long periods of inactivity. These periods were often spent calculating their pay to the penny, and I was responsible for the key



information that went to payroll. One day, I noticed that Joe had been called out for a special train on a Sunday and his timesheet showed a booked time of 3hrs 3mins. Up to 3hrs was paid as 4hrs at time & three quarter – a 7 hour call, but the extra three minutes gained him 8 hrs pay - a 14 hour call. His train register book, showing all the times for the special train, matched his claim. However, he got the lower amount after Polly looked at the Train Register books at the adjacent boxes and found that the train travelled at 20mph approaching his box and 140 afterwards! Joe didn't argue because he knew that falsifying train register entries could carry a prison sentence.
